

At a meeting on Wednesday attended by a wide range of community organisations, SAPS, Traffic and Law Enforcement officials, Principal Inspector Ramsay of City Law Enforcement outlined planned Public Safety activities over the coming holiday season along the False Bay coastline from Strandfontein to Cape Point. In respect of our SRA it is planned that Law Enforcement officers will be deployed to the following areas and amenities, subject to possible emergency redeployment:

- the Kalk Bay harbour tunnels and access to the beach
- Woolley's Pool
- the SRA kiosk at Kalk Bay
- Danger Beach
- the St James Law Enforcement office
- the Dalebrook pool area
- the St James observation tower
- the St James/Muizenberg walk way
- the Bailey's Cottage observation tower

Further details were provided regarding plans to deploy Law Enforcement officers on foot patrols, bicycles, motor bikes, even horses and quad bikes on the Muizenberg dunes.

Details were also provided on plans to control and facilitate traffic flow.

SAPS and Law Enforcement are both aware the SRA have cameras covering Main Road from Clairvaux lights to Belmont and the St James station area. They can reference these cameras through the SRA for information and LE are hoping to take live feed in their new Control Room in Muizenberg shortly.

Inspector Ramsay was given full support by all the many community organisations represented at the meeting. Residents are urged to assist these officials in their important work by providing refreshments and encouragement. This will all contribute to the aim of a safe and enjoyable holiday season for all.
