I have been following the various updates on property development and infrastructure projects with great interest over the past few years.

As a resident of the far south peninsula I am experiencing the huge

pressure that our infrastructure is taking.

Ageing roads and water supply being two main problems.

In Glencairn we have been suffering with low water pressure and regularly bursting pipes for years. The City is seemingly unable to fix this.

All the current road infrastructure upgrades are simply fixing and replacing existing infrastructure. No new roads to the deep south are being built because it is impossible to build more or even increase the capacity of existing roads.

We have Ou Kaapse Weg and Main Road, that's it. Both of these can not be added to.

Chapman's Peak Drive cannot be counted as it is unreliable and highly weather dependent.

The reality is that even after all the work has been done, we will not even be able to cope with current traffic

needs.

I have not even ventured into the area of schools and the totally inadequate planning in this regard.

You have dealt with this in the past.

The City continues to approve high density developments in the Deep South.

The Dido Valley, Capri, Ou Kaapse Weg, Black Hill and other projects have already been approved and certainly there will be others in the pipeline.

These are all high density projects.

As our mayor, Patricia de Lille, said regarding the Clifton development, "the City needs the money". How much of our own money have residents spent fighting these developments?

Well, I think it is time we residents in the south put our feet down and let the City know that we do not approve.

2016 sees municipal elections and we should

all vote for an opposition party.

If the City is not willing to take our interests at heart, maybe their opposition will.
