

- It has been a relatively quiet time over the festive season. The patrollers notify Anna of any new faces in the area. Anna keeps a record of all vagrants, homeless, etc so is aware if there are any new faces. She is in contact with the field workers who work between Muizenberg and Simonstown.
- There is still concern over a family with two children who migrate between Muizenberg and Fish Hoek. They are not willing to talk to Anna and it is not known whether they have permanent accommodation or not and whether the children attend school during the term. Social Services are aware of the situation.
- The field worker program has been re-introduced by the City.
- Pastor Shoddy from My Father's House in Simonstown donated 7 pairs of tekkies which Anna distributed amongst the people whom she felt were trying to improve their circumstances.
- Pastor Shoddy donated meals to the homeless in the harbour over the festive season. This now has ceased as there is no way to get the food from Simonstown to Kalk Bay.
- There are a number of previously indigent people from the area who have found permanent accommodation and jobs.
- There was a strong PRASA security presence on the trains and at the stations once the train schedule had been resumed.
- There were questions asked as to why the kiosk was not manned by Law Enforcement/SAPS/SRA patrollers over the season.
- Anna assisted SAPS and Social Services on the busy days with the reuniting of 'lost' children with parents and family. All children were reunited and Social Services made a note to follow up on the children's well-being in the coming weeks.
